## DIASPORA INVOLVEMENT IN DEVELOPMENT: COOPERATION BETWEEN LATVIAN DIASPORA PROFESSIONALS AND LATVIA

As international migration increases, many countries are actively developing links with their diasporas and are not looking at migrants as 'lost human resources' but as 'diaspora capital' and focusing on the potential of the diaspora. One such area of intervention is diaspora diplomacy, as diplomacy and international policy-making are now predominantly a 'game of skill and mastery', and in this context the diaspora network can play important role in strategically purposefully expanding policy-makers with financial and human resources, increasing their international influence and better defending their interests. Many countries, including France, Denmark, Estonia, Israel and Canada, recognise this potential and actively work with diaspora professionals in international organisations to promote their home country's strategic, diplomatic and international policy objectives. Latvia is also interested in involving diaspora professionals more strongly and more specifically in the representation of its political interests abroad, in public diplomacy and in the creation and dissemination of a specific state abroad. The study examined the image willingness of Latvian diaspora professionals working in international organisations to engage in diaspora diplomacy, existing cooperation practices and the benefits of such cooperation from the perspective of the professionals.
